
Jesus Walking on the Sea

Matthew 14:22-33; Mark 6:45-52; John 6:15-21



The Story

Jesus had just finished feeding the 5000 people. The people wanted to make Him king. But this is not what Jesus wanted. He had His disciples get into a boat to go to the other side of the lake. He told the people to go home. He went up on a mountain to pray by Himself.

When it was evening the disciples in the boat were in the middle of the lake. They were trying to row across, but a storm came and the wind was so strong they couldn't. Jesus was not with them, but He was alone on the land.

Jesus did not stay on the land. The disciples needed His help. In the middle of the night, Jesus walked on the water toward the boat. When the disciples saw Him coming they were very scared and said, "It is a ghost."

But Jesus spoke right away and told them not to be afraid. He said, "Be happy. It's Jesus. Do not be afraid."

Peter answered Jesus. "Lord, if it is You, tell me to come to You on the water."

And Jesus told Peter to come. So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water toward Jesus.

But then Peter saw the big waves and became scared. He started to sink. He called out to Jesus to save him. Jesus reached out His hand and helped Peter. He asked Peter why He had doubted Him.

Then Jesus stepped into the boat. As soon as He did the storm stopped-the wind stopped blowing and the lake was calm. The boat was also at the other side of the lake. The disciples weren't out in the middle any longer.

The disciples worshiped their Savior in thankfulness. "Truly You are the Son of God."

Jesus walked on water to help His disciples.
