
Daniel

Daniel 1 - 2



God was with Daniel and his friends in a strange country. God told Daniel the king's dream about the future of the kingdom of Babylon.

The Story

Daniel was a young boy from the land of Judah. He lived during the saddest days in history. His people had lost their country and their city and their temple. 

Although our nation and all nations will one day be destroyed, we are believers and members of the Kingdom of God and so shall live forever.


Activity One - Circle the table with the food Daniel and his friends ate. Put an X on the table of the king's food. Why couldn't Daniel and his friends eat that food?
