
## **Israel Enters the Promised Land**

Joshua 1, 3-5

What are these priests carrying?
They are in the middle of the Jordan River. Why are they not getting wet?
What miracle was done by God and what reminder did God's people have for future generations?
Let's read to find out the answers.

## The Story - Joshua 1, 3-5

After the death of Moses the servant of the LORD, it came to pass that the LORD spoke to Joshua the son of Nun, Moses' assistant, saying: {2} "Moses My servant is dead. Now therefore, arise, go over this Jordan, you and all this people, to the land which I am giving to them; the children of Israel. {3} "Every place that the sole of your foot will tread upon I have given you, as I said to Moses... "No man shall be able to stand before you all the days of your life; as I was with Moses, so I will be with you. I will not leave you nor forsake you.

{6} "Be strong and of good courage, for to this people you shall divide as an inheritance the land which I swore to their fathers to give them. {7} "Only be strong" and very courageous, that you may observe to do according to all the law which Moses My servant commanded you; do not turn from it to the right hand or to the left, that you may prosper wherever you go. {8} "This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate in it day and night, that you may observe to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success. {9} "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and of good courage; do not be afraid, nor be dismayed, for the



LORD your God is with you wherever you go."

- {10} Then Joshua commanded the officers of the people, saying, {11} "Pass through the camp and command the people, saying, 'Prepare provisions for yourselves, for within three days you will cross over this Jordan, to go in to possess the land which the LORD your God is giving you to possess."...
- {16} So they answered Joshua, saying, "All that you command us we will do, and wherever you send us we will go. {17} "Just as we heeded Moses in all things, so we will heed you. Only the LORD your God be with you, as He was with Moses. {18} "Whoever rebels against your command and does not heed your words, in all that you command him, shall be put to death. Only be strong and of good courage."

(Joshua 3) Then Joshua rose early in the morning; and they set out from Acacia Grove and came to the Jordan, he and all the children of Israel, and lodged there before they crossed over. {2} So it was, after three days, that the officers went through the camp; {3} and they commanded the people, saying, "When you see the ark of the covenant of the LORD your God, and the priests, the Levites, bearing it, then you shall set out from your place and go after it. {4} "Yet there shall be a space between you and it, about two thousand cubits by measure. Do not come near it, that you may know the way by which you must go, for you have not passed this way before."

{5} And Joshua said to the people,"Sanctify yourselves, for tomorrow the LORD

will do wonders among you."

- {6} Then Joshua spoke to the priests, saying, "Take up the ark of the covenant and cross over before the people." So they took up the ark of the covenant and went before the people.
- {7} And the LORD said to Joshua,
  "This day I will begin to exalt you in the
  sight of all Israel, that they may know that,
  as I was with Moses, so I will be with you. {8}
  "You shall command the priests who bear
  the ark of the covenant, saying, 'When you
  have come to the edge of the water of
  the Jordan, you shall stand in the Jordan.'"
- {9} So Joshua said to the children of Israel, "Come here, and hear the words of the LORD your God." (10) And Joshua said, "By this you shall know that the living God is among you, and that He will without fail drive out from before you the Canaanites and the Hittites and the Hivites and the Perizzites and the Girgashites and the Amorites and the Jebusites: {11} "Behold, the ark of the covenant of the Lord of all the earth is crossing over before you into the Jordan. {12} "Now therefore, take for yourselves twelve men from the tribes of Israel, one man from every tribe. {13} "And it shall come to pass, as soon as the soles of the feet of the priests who bear the ark of the LORD, the Lord of all the earth, shall rest in the waters of the Jordan, that the waters of the Jordan shall be cut off, the waters that come down from upstream, and they shall stand as a heap."
- {14} So it was, when the people set out from their camp to cross over the Jordan, with the priests bearing the ark of the covenant before the people, {15} and as those who bore the ark came to the

Jordan, and the feet of the priests who bore the ark dipped in the edge of the water (for the Jordan overflows all its banks during the whole time of harvest), {16} that the waters which came down from upstream stood still, and rose in a heap very far away at Adam, the city that is beside Zaretan. So the waters that went down into the Sea of the Arabah, the Salt Sea, failed, and were cut off; and the people crossed over opposite Jericho. {17} Then the priests who bore the ark of the covenant of the LORD stood firm on dry ground in the midst of the Jordan; and all Israel crossed over on dry ground, until all the people had crossed completely over the Jordan.

(Joshua 4) And it came to pass, when all the people had completely crossed over the Jordan, that the LORD spoke to Joshua, saying: {2} "Take for yourselves twelve men from the people, one man from every tribe, {3} "and command them, saying, 'Take for yourselves twelve stones from here, out of the midst of the Jordan, from the place where the priests' feet stood firm. You shall carry them over with you and leave them in the lodging place where you lodge tonight."

{4} Then Joshua called the twelve men whom he had appointed from the children of Israel, one man from every tribe; {5} and Joshua said to them: "Cross over before the ark of the LORD your God into the midst of the Jordan, and each one of you take up a stone on his shoulder, according to the number of the tribes of the children of Israel, {6} "that this may be a sign among you when your children ask in time to come, saying, 'What do these

stones mean to you?' {7} "Then you shall answer them that the waters of the Jordan were cut off before the ark of the covenant of the LORD; when it crossed over the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan were cut off. And these stones shall be for a memorial to the children of Israel forever."

{8} And the children of Israel did so, just as Joshua commanded, and took up twelve stones from the midst of the Jordan, as the LORD had spoken to Joshua, according to the number of the tribes of the children of Israel, and carried them over with them to the place where they lodged, and laid them down there. {9} Then Joshua set up twelve stones in the midst of the Jordan, in the place where the feet of the priests who bore the ark of the covenant stood; and they are there to this day.

{10} So the priests who bore the ark stood in the midst of the Jordan until everything was finished that the LORD had commanded Joshua to speak to the people, according to all that Moses had commanded Joshua; and the people hurried and crossed over. {11} Then it came to pass, when all the people had completely crossed over, that the ark of the LORD and the priests crossed over in the presence of the people...{13} About forty thousand prepared for war crossed over before the LORD for battle, to the plains of Jericho.

- {14} On that day the LORD exalted Joshua in the sight of all Israel; and they feared him, as they had feared Moses, all the days of his life.
  - {15} Then the LORD spoke to Joshua,

saying, {16} "Command the priests who bear the ark of the Testimony to come up from the Jordan."

- {17} Joshua therefore commanded the priests, saying, "Come up from the Jordan."
- {18} And it came to pass, when the priests who bore the ark of the covenant of the LORD had come from the midst of the Jordan, and the soles of the priests' feet touched the dry land, that the waters of the Jordan returned to their place and overflowed all its banks as before.
- {19} Now the people came up from the Jordan on the tenth day of the first month, and they camped in Gilgal on the east border of Jericho. (20) And those twelve stones which they took out of the Jordan, Joshua set up in Gilgal. {21} Then he spoke to the children of Israel, saying: "When your children ask their fathers in time to come, saying, 'What are these stones?' {22} "then you shall let your children know, saying, 'Israel crossed over this Jordan on dry land'; {23} "for the LORD your God dried up the waters of the Jordan before you until you had crossed over, as the LORD your God did to the Red Sea, which He dried up before us until we had crossed over, {24} "that all the peoples of the earth may know the hand of the LORD, that it is

mighty, that you may fear the LORD your God forever."

- (Joshua 5) So it was, when all the kings of the Amorites who were on the west side of the Jordan, and all the kings of the Canaanites who were by the sea, heard that the LORD had dried up the waters of the Jordan from before the children of Israel until we had crossed over, that their heart melted; and there was no spirit in them any longer because of the children of Israel...
- {9} Then the LORD said to Joshua, "This day I have rolled away the reproach of Egypt from you." Therefore the name of the place is called Gilgal to this day.
- {10} Now the children of Israel camped in Gilgal, and kept the Passover on the fourteenth day of the month at twilight on the plains of Jericho. {11} And they ate of the produce of the land on the day after the Passover, unleavened bread and parched grain, on the very same day. {12} Then the manna ceased on the day after they had eaten the produce of the land; and the children of Israel no longer had manna, but they ate the food of the land of Canaan that year.

Outer Aim - God was with Joshua and the Children of Israel and led them into the promised land of Canaan.
