Ruth 1-4

The Story

Parents: Review this lesson with your child.

God sent a famine in the land of Israel. That means there was hardly any food for the people or animals.

Many people did not love God, but not all the people had forgotten the true God. A man from Bethlehem named Elimelech and his wife Naomi trusted in the true God. They took their two sons to the land of Moab to live because there was food to eat there.

After some time Elimelech died.
Naomi's sons each married a lady from Moab.
One lady was named Orpah, the other was
named Ruth. After a few more years, Naomi's
sons died too. Naomi and Orpah and Ruth
were all alone.

After some time, Naomi heard that food was growing again in Bethlehem. She wanted to move back to her old home. Orpah and Ruth said they would go too. But Naomi told them to go home to their own mom and dad. Orpah said goodbye to Naomi, but Ruth would not leave. She loved the true God and wanted to help Naomi. She said to Naomi, "I will live where you live, I will worship your God, and I will die where you die." So they both moved to Bethlehem.

Naomi and Ruth were very poor, so Ruth would go into a field of grain and gather up the leftover grain to make bread. God caused her to gather grain in the field of a rich believer named Boaz. He saw Ruth and asked who she was. When he heard how much she loved and cared for Naomi, he told his workers to let her eat and drink with them. They should also leave extra grain behind just for her to pick up. He talked with Ruth and told her to keep on working in his field. She was very thankful to him for helping her, even though she was from a different country. Boaz helped her because

he also loved the true God.

Ruth kept gathering grain in Boaz's field and soon Boaz and Ruth were married. Now Boaz would take care of Ruth and Naomi. God blessed Ruth and Boaz with a baby boy named Obed. When Obed grew up, he had a son named Jesse. Jesse grew up to have a son named David. David became the first king of Israel. Many, many years later Jesus our Savior was born from the family of David. Jesus came to earth to die on the cross to take away all people's sins.


