Peter and Cornelius - Level 1

The Story

Cornelius was a Roman soldier who lived in Caesarea. He believed in God and prayed to Him all the time, but he did not know about Jesus. God wanted him to know about Jesus, his Savior. God sent an angel to Cornelius. The angel said, "Cornelius!"

Cornelius was afraid and said, "What is it?"

The angel said, "God has heard your prayers. Send some men to Joppa to get Simon Peter. He will tell you what to do."
