The Story - Exodus 2:11 - 4:20

Now it came to pass in those days, when Moses was grown, that he went out to his brethren and looked at their burdens. And he saw an Egyptian beating a Hebrew, one of his brethren. {12} So he looked this way and that way, and when he saw no one, he killed the Egyptian and hid him in the sand. {13} And when he went out the second day, behold, two Hebrew men were fighting, and he said to the one who did the wrong, "Why are you striking your companion?"

{14} Then he said, "Who made you a prince and a judge over us? Do you intend to kill me as you killed the Egyptian?" So Moses feared and said, "Surely this thing is known!"

{15} When Pharaoh heard of this matter, he sought to kill Moses. But Moses fled from the face of Pharaoh and dwelt in the land of Midian; and he sat down by a well. {16} Now the priest of Midian had seven daughters. And they came and drew water, and they filled the troughs to water their father's flock. {17} Then the shepherds came and drove them



away; but Moses stood up and helped them, and watered their flock.

{18} When they came to Reuel their father, he said, "How is it that you have come so soon today?"

{19} And they said, "An Egyptian delivered us from the hand of the shepherds, and he also drew enough water for us and watered the flock."

{20} So he said to his daughters, "And where is he? Why is it that you have left the man? Call him, that he may eat bread."

{21} Then Moses was content to live with the man, and he gave Zipporah his daughter to Moses. {22} And she bore him a son, and he called his name Gershom; for he said, "I have been a stranger in a foreign land."

{23} Now it happened in the process of time that the king of Egypt died. Then the children of Israel groaned because of the bondage, and they cried out; and their cry came up to God because of the bondage. {24} So God heard their groaning, and God remembered His covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob. {25} And God looked upon the children of Israel, and God acknowledged them.

(Exodus 3) Now Moses was tending the flock of Jethro his father-in-law, the priest of Midian. And he led the flock to the back of the desert, and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. {2} And the Angel of the LORD appeared to him in a flame of fire from the midst of a bush. So he looked, and behold, the bush was burning with fire, but the bush was not consumed. {3} Then Moses said, "I will now turn aside and see this great sight, why the bush does not burn."

{4} So when the LORD saw that he turned aside to look, God called to him from the midst of the bush and said, "Moses, Moses!"

And he said, "Here I am."

{5} Then He said, "Do not draw near this place. Take your sandals off your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground." {6} Moreover He said, "I am the God of your father; the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look upon God.

{7} And the LORD said: "I have surely seen the oppression of My people who are in Egypt, and have heard their cry because of their taskmasters, for I know their sorrows. {8} "So I have come down to deliver them out of the hand of the Egyptians, and to bring them up from that land to a good and large land, to a land flowing with milk and honey, to the place of the Canaanites and the Hittites and the Amorites and the Perizzites and the Hivites and the Jebusites. {9} "Now therefore, behold, the cry of the children of Israel has come to Me, and I have also seen the oppression with which the Egyptians oppress them. {10} "Come now, therefore, and I will send you to Pharaoh that you may bring My people, the children of Israel, out of Egypt."

{11} But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh, and that I should bring the children of Israel out of Egypt?"

{18} "Then they will heed your voice; and you shall come, you and the elders of Israel, to the king of Egypt; and you shall say to him, 'The LORD God of the Hebrews has met with us; and now, please, let us go three days' journey into the wilderness, that we may sacrifice to the LORD our God.' {19} "But I am sure that the king of Egypt will not let you go, no, not even by a mighty hand. {20} "So I will stretch out My hand and strike Egypt with all My wonders which I will do in its midst; and after that he will let you go.

BACKGROUND

(Rupprecht Bible History References, Vol. 1, pp. 152-156)

Moses grew up in the palace of the Pharaoh. He was cared for like a son of Pharaoh's daughter. There he grew up amidst the gorgeous surroundings and atmosphere of princely living. He was given what was considered to be the best education available. Egyptian history, culture and religion was to be part of the life of Moses. He learned of the worship of false gods such as the sun god Ra and other deities that were invented by the Egyptians. We can only imagine the deep conflict which must have existed between what he was learning as an Egyptian and what his mother had taught him as a child. 2:11-15

Although he must have been aware of the situation under which his fellow Hebrews labored, yet we are told that when he was forty years of age (Acts 7:23) he observed the especially cruel treatment of one of the children of Israel. He became enraged by the beating which he observed and killed the Egyptian. When Moses became aware that Pharaoh heard of it, he left Egypt and fled for his life to Midian. Midian lies in Arabia near the northeastern arm of the Red Sea. Was Moses right in committing this murder? Certainly not. Even though coming to the aid of his people was evidently very strong in his mind and heart, he was approaching the matter, not according to the will of God but according to his own plan of action. (Acts 7:25) 2:16 - 22

The Call of Moses

OTO

Moses, who grew up in luxury, now found himself in the rural desert land of Midian. There he became a shepherd of the flocks of Reuel (also called Jethro 3:1; 4:18; Numbers 10:29) the priest of Midian and eventually married his daughter Zipporah.2:23 - 3:10. Forty years had passed (Acts 7:30) since Moses had left Egypt. He was now eighty years of age and continued as a shepherd. His shepherding led him southward as far as Mt. Horeb (Mt. Sinai). There God choose to speak to Moses out of a burning bush with one request: "I will send you to Pharaoh that you may bring My people, the children of Israel, out of Egypt." (Ex. 3:10) (3:11 - 4:17)

Moses had four serious considerations:

- 1. "Who am I?"
- 2. "What is His name?" ("Who shall I say has sent me?")
- 3. "They will not believe me."
- 4. "I am slow of speech." (Ex. 4:18 31)

Finally, Moses returns to Egypt as deliverer of the children of Israel according to the will of God. The people

bow their heads and worship their gracious God.

Heavenly Father, I thank You for calling me into Your kingdom and blessing me with Your forgiveness and love. I pray that You will fill me with Your Spirit that I may gladly serve You in any way I can that Your name may be glorified and Your kingdom come to many. In Your holy name I pray.

PRESENTATION

From the birth of Moses and his discovery in the reeds by the Princess to his calling as deliverer of the Children of Israel the Lord God guides, leads and brings about happenings according to His will. Yet, Moses was not like a puppet on a string. He had his weaknesses as well as his strengths. Nevertheless, the Lord God used him to accomplish what He willed in His own way and time.

To accomplish His purpose God used others who would aid Moses in carrying out His plan. The mother of Moses apparently taught him all about the one true God and the promises of the Messiah. God used Aaron, the brother of Moses, to be the "spokesman to the people" on behalf of Moses.

God's hand in the life of Moses was obviously operative in accomplishing His plan for His people and finally His plan of salvation for the whole world.

APPLICATIONS

What do the questions of Moses found in Ex. 3:11 and 4:17 reveal about this man who has now arrived at the age of 80 years?

Consider such attributes as confidence, courage and faith in the life of a Christian. Discuss the significance of the name God gives to Himself, I AM.

All of us have weaknesses as well as strengths. God uses us just as we are for the work of His kingdom. Discuss abilities that God has given each of us and how we might use them to glorify and praise God.

How does God overcome weaknesses in each of us?

Hebrews 11:24-25 - By faith Moses, when he became of age, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin,

The Call of Moses Exodus 2:11 - 4:20

The Story

Parents: Review this lesson with your child.

Did you ever see a fire in a fireplace or at a campfire? The wood burns and gets very black and turns to ashes. The same thing happens in the forest sometimes to trees and bushes! But we are going to learn about a bush that was on fire but didn't burn!

Moses grew up as a prince in the palace of Egypt. He was raised as an Egyptian even though he was an Israelite. When he was older he saw an Egyptian beating an Israelite slave and Moses killed the Egyptian. He was in trouble for that and had to run away from the palace of Egypt.

Moses went to the land of Midian and became a shepherd. One day while Moses was in the desert watching the sheep he saw a bush burning with fire but the bush did not burn to ashes. The Angel of the LORD appeared to him in the burning bush. The Angel of the LORD called to him and said, "Moses, Moses!"

Moses said, "Here I am."

God said, "Take off your shoes, for this is holy ground." And Moses hid his face; he was afraid to look at God.

The Lord said, "I have seen that my people in Egypt are very sad. I have heard their prayers to me for help. I want you to go and help the children of Israel and lead them to a good land where they will be happy."

Moses heard God, but he was afraid, and said, "Who am I to do this? It will be too hard for me. I cannot speak well and the people of Israel will not believe that You have sent me. Who shall I say has sent me?"

God answered, "Tell them that I AM has sent me to you."
