1 Samuel 16



The Story

The children of Israel asked the Lord to give them kings to rule their country. For many years Saul was the king. God decided to replace Saul as king so God spoke to the prophet Samuel.

Now the LORD said to Samuel, "Take oil to anoint a new king. Go to Bethlehem to a man named Jesse. I will choose a new king from his sons."

So Samuel did what the LORD said, and went to Bethlehem.

When Samuel saw Jesse's oldest son, Eliab, he said, "Surely the Lord wants me to anoint Eliab as king."
