The Story

There was a great famine in the land of Canaan. Jacob heard there was grain in Egypt, so he told his sons, "Go down to that place and buy for us there that we may live and not die." So Joseph's ten brothers went down to Egypt to buy grain. Jacob would not send Benjamin, however, "lest some calamity befall him".

Now at that time, Joseph was the governor of Egypt. He was the one who sold the grain to all who came to buy it. So Joseph's brothers came and bowed their faces to the earth before him. Joseph recognized them, but they didn't know him. He spoke roughly to them, "Where do you come from?"

They answered, "From the land of Canaan to buy food."

Joseph remembered the dreams he had had. He said to them, "You are spies! You have come to see the effects of the famine!" The brothers protested that they were only there to buy food, but Joseph accused them again of being spies.

They pleaded, "Your servants are twelve brothers, the sons of one man in the land of Canaan; and in fact, the youngest is with our father today, and one is no more."

Again Joseph said they were spies. Finally he said, "In this manner you shall be tested: By the life of Pharaoh, you shall not leave this place unless your youngest brother comes here. Send one of you, and let him bring your brother; and you shall be kept in prison, that your words may be tested to see whether there is any truth in you; or else, by the life of Pharaoh, surely you are spies!" Joseph put them all in prison for three days.

On the third day, he told them he would let all but one brother get food and return to Canaan. One would be kept in prison until the youngest brother was brought back as proof that they were telling the truth. They all started talking about the situation in front of



Joseph. They were upset because they remembered what they had done to Joseph years before; now they felt they were being punished for sinning against him. Although Joseph had spoken to them in Egyptian through an interpreter, he understood their language and heard every word. He felt so sorrowful over their distress that he had to turn

away from them and weep. When he returned, he bound Simeon and took him away.

Then Joseph commanded that all their sacks be filled with grain. He told his servants to put their money back in the sacks as well as provisions for their journey. The brothers then loaded their donkeys with the grain and left.

Along the way, one of the

brothers opened his sack to feed his donkey. He was surprised and afraid when he saw the money back in his sack. He told his brothers all about it, and they too were terrified. It looked like they had stolen the grain!

They traveled back to Canaan, where they immediately told their father Jacob all that had happened to them. When each brother emptied out his sack, the money came tumbling out with the grain.

Jacob was very upset. "You have bereaved me," he said, "Joseph is


no more, Simeon is no more, and you want to take Benjamin. All these things are against me."
